Enhance the district's instructional programs to improve student outcomes	 Elementary: Teachers are planning for small group, differentiated instruction, based on data, to personalize the learning experience. Teachers in grades K-5 have implemented a new literacy program, Magnetic Reading Literacy Portfolio, which provides students with an explicit and systematic approach for learning how to read. Teachers in grades K - 2 are fully implementing the program, and some teachers in grades 3-5 have volunteered to pilot the program to see where we need more support with PD and (if necessary) supplemental materials. The district implemented a What I Need (WIN) Period during the ELA period to ensure all students' needs were being met. The district restructured its intervention program to reflect a multi-tiered system of support framework for mathematics and ELA. Monthly check-ins with Reading & Math Intervention Teams to discuss data, program implementation, additional support needed for teachers, and best practices to share with teachers. Our technology teachers have implemented a revised curriculum that provides the base from which to develop the skill and knowledge needed to be successful communicators, problem-solvers, global citizens, and innovators. The Gifted and Talented teacher either pushes into class or pulls students out of class. The program integrates STEAM activities, curriculum enrichment while aligning seamlessly with NJSLS Career Readiness, Life Literacy, and Key Skills Learning Standards.Gifted and Talented <i>MidYear Universal Screeners (iReady & DIBELS) administered in January following protocols.</i> <i>Monthly check-ins with interventionists focused on supporting teachers with standards alignment and FAQs on 2/2/24</i> Hosted a Parent Information night on Elementary Literacy Instruction in WTPS. Parents were informed on the research behind our decision to move to a structured, explicit approach to teaching ALL aspects of reading so ALL students can become skilled readers. (4/16/24)<

 Developed a Math Program Review Plan for Grades 4 - 12 which was introduced to a committee of volunteer teachers on 4/24. Beginning in February, DoC K5 & Math Supervisor met with several vendors, obtained sample materials and rec'd an overview of each program. Highlights of each program were shared with the committee. Committee members were given a rubric to evaluate each program based on specific criteria in order to narrow the selection to 3. Using every last penny of ESSER funds, Summer Knight Academy 2024 was created and offered to all students currently receiving reading intervention - (Invitation only window for registration). All other K-5 students were invited to sign up (first-come, first-serve. The program was at capacity with 2 sections of 20 in grades K-4 and only a few open spots in grades 5,by the 5/15/24 deadline. Committee received training on the 3 programs that were picked as pilots in 24-25. 8 teachers will be piloting 3 programs over grades 4 & 5 for the 24-25 school year. (5/28/24) The Reading Intervention team and Elementary Principals worked with DoC K5 to update MTSS protocols and timelines based on feedback from teachers this year. (6/4/24) The updated plan will be shared with teachers in the BTS C&I Newsletter. End of Year Universal Screeners (iReady & DIBELS) administered (5/28/24 - 6/7/24) following protocols. Hosted a Parent Information Night on 6/12/24 - "Let's Avoid the Summer Slide" Created a team of teachers to revise the grades 3-5 report cards. The team will decide what type of report card is best for each grade level. New report cards and assessment schedules will be developed this summer.
 Secondary: WHS created a committee to research and propose a new master schedule. A committee of high school employees researched and proposed the details to implement a dual enrollment program for the 2023-2024 school year. A group of stakeholders have been researching the benefits and concerns of ranking students (e.g. student wellness, college admissions, etc.) The district hired a new NNDCC instructor who has increased enrollment to 41 cadets (to date) and has implemented more co-curricular opportunities for the cadets. Teachers are planning for small group, differentiated instruction, based on data, to personalize the learning experience. Intervention teachers at the secondary level are working with students in both math and ELA to support students to achieve their full potential. World Language Students in Grades 11 & 12 had the opportunity to take the Seal of Biliteracy Exam in January 2024.

These plans and assessments incorporate rich performance tasks that present real-world challenges, providing authentic contexts for students to apply their knowledge. Through performance tasks, students will demonstrate their understanding and proficiency as tangible evidence of their learning while aligning with the department's vision and mission. This included an outside consultant to collaborate with science teachers as they shifted instruction. Social Studies students 6-12 are analyzing primary sources using a scaffolded model which includes - content, historical context, intended audience, point of view, purpose, and outside information. Social Students 6-12 are writing Document-Based Questions (DBQ's) using a grade-level framework to build upon their writing each year.
