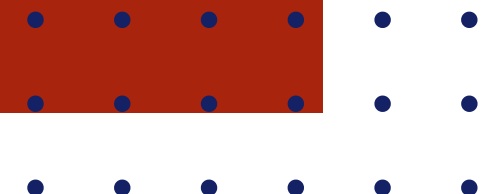

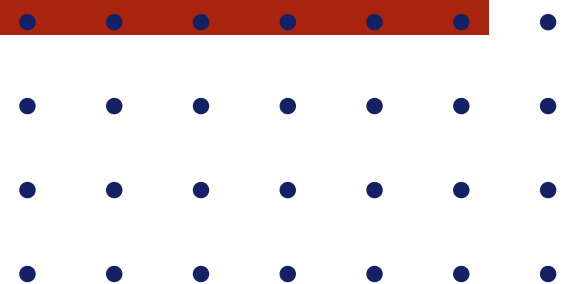

Goal 4:

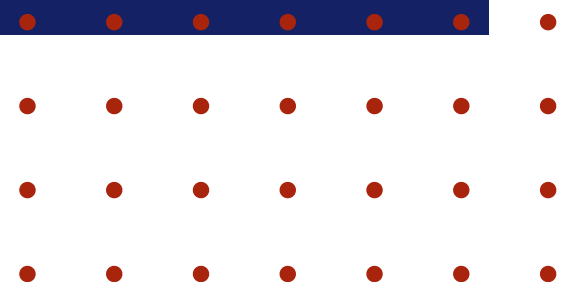
